## Richard Peck's Ten Questions to Ask about a Novel

For the past three years, Matthew Panozzo has implemented these questions as a reader response activity complimenting his students' independent reading. He has implemented these questions in both the intermediate and secondary classroom settings.

- 1. What would this story be like if the main character were of the opposite sex?
- 2. Why is this story set where it is (not what is the setting)?
- 3. If you were to film this story, what characters would you eliminate if you couldn't use them all?
- 4. Would you film this story in black and white or in color? Explain your answer.
- 5. How is the main character different from you?
- 6. Why would or wouldn't this story make a good TV series?
- 7. What's one thing in this story that's happened to you?
- 8. Reread the first paragraph of Chapter 1. What's in it that makes you read on?
- 9. If you designed a new cover for this book, what would it look like?
- 10. What does the title tell you about the book? Does it tell the truth?

Can you think of other questions students can answer that would get them to think about their novels differently?
