At our final 2015-2016 TALE Board of Directors' meeting in June, we reflected on the accomplishments of our organization over the past year. It was a record setting year in many ways thanks to the hard work and time invested from our committees, our members, and our officers! A few of our many accomplishments included:

• <u>January 2016</u>: TALE's rapid growth necessitated a fully online membership process, which also enables us to monitor membership trends.

- <u>February 2016</u>: TALE co-hosted the 2016 Literacy Summit with Specialized Literacy Professionals and University of the Incarnate Word. Our two-day annual conference was a huge success with over 300 attendees engaged in professional learning and networking.
- <u>Spring/Summer 2016</u>: Several TALE members have continued to participate actively in the ELAR TEKS review process.

TALE's Community Involvement Committee has also spearheaded several efforts to advance literacy in Texas, including donating several boxes of books and establishing the first Little Free Library in San Antonio. Finally, TALE's Advocacy Development Committee applied for and received the International Literacy Association's Advocacy Award. TALE members continue to work diligently and already have big plans for the upcoming months! Each TALE committee developed their annual goals, which were all merged into TALE's 2015-2016 Strategic Plan SMART Goals. Also, planning for TALE's annual conference is currently underway! This event will be held at Texas A&M University - Corpus Christi on February 10-11, 2017. Our conference will provide literacy stakeholders with many wonderful opportunities to engage in professional learning and networking.
