



Jack Cassidy is a Professor Emeritus at Millersville University in Pennsylvania and is recently retired from Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi where he was Associate Dean for Graduate Studies in the College of Education and a Professor in the department of Curriculum and Instruction. He is known for his work on literacy trends and issues as exemplified by numerous articles in professional journals as well as his yearly column in Reading Today “What’s Hot What’s Not in Literacy.” He has authored a number of text series for K-12 students, including Read-Reason-Write. He is a former President of the International Reading Association and the College Reading Association and is the recipient of the A.B. Herr Award from that group for outstanding contributions to the field of reading. In addition, he was inducted into the Reading Hall of Fame in 2010 and received the Association of Literacy Educators and Researchers Laureate Award in the same year. Other awards include the: IRA Special Service Award; Paul A Witty Meritorious Service Award; Pennsylvania Teacher Educator of the Year Award, and the LEADER IRA Special Interest Group Literacy Award. He also has many publications and much experience in the field of gifted education.
